# Founded in 1949, currently 46 member States after Russia's expulsion on 16 March 2022

- 1. Three pillars: rule of law, democracy and human rights
- 2. Areas of competence: all areas with the exception of defence issues
- **3. Three areas of work**: standard-setting; monitoring; cooperation and assistance
- 4. Penitentiary area: Council for Penological Co-operation (PC-CP); European Committee for the Prevention of Torture (CPT); European Court of Human Rights; Co-operation activities, HELP online courses
- 5. Training and professional development of prison and probation staff: always on the agenda


