# **Judicial training**

 training of justice professionals on EU law covering all areas: from civil, criminal and administrative law to fundamental rights

#### Objectives:

- Ensure the correct and effective application of EU law
- Facilitate judicial cooperation in civil and criminal matters
- Support tool for promoting the rule of law culture and the respect of the EU Charter of fundamental rights
- Equip justice professionals with necessary knowledge of EU law and non-legal skills needed in the daily work

### European judicial training strategy (1/3)

- Communication on 'Ensuring justice in the EU a European judicial training strategy' for 2021-2024
- Four-strand approach

#### 1. Training substance

- Address broad areas of EU law
- New priorities to promote a common rule of law culture, uphold fundamental rights, upscale the digitalisation of justice
- Provide a flexible response to emerging and continuous EU law training needs
- Include the development of professional skills
- continuous assessment of training needs and a flexible reactivity in the training offer





### European judicial training strategy (2/3)

#### 2. Training audience

- All professionals involved in the administration of justice
- Now: including prison and probation staff
- Geographical coverage: the EU and beyond

#### 3. Training methodology

- Promoting high quality, effective training activities
- Using modern training methods that ensure learning by doing
- Benefiting from digitalisation





### **European judicial training strategy** (3/3)

#### 4. Shared responsibility

- Between Member States, training providers, national and European justice professions' organisations, and the EU
- For delivering this ambitious agenda, the Commission relies on all stakeholders involved in training and the individual justice professionals
- The Commission will continue supporting high-quality training projects with a European dimension

### **EU** financial support (1/2)

#### 1. Justice Programme

- **2021-2027**
- Budget: 305 Mio €
- Annual calls including a dedicated training call

#### Objectives:

- support judicial cooperation in civil and criminal matters
- support training of judges and other legal practitioners
- effective access to justice for citizens and businesses





### **EU** financial support (2/2)

#### 2. CERV Programme

2021-2027

Budget: 1,55 Bill. €

#### objectives:

- support and develop open, rights-based, democratic, equal and inclusive societies based on the rule of law
- protect and promote rights and values as enshrined in the EU
   Treaties and the Charter of Fundamental Rights





### **Annual reports**

- Yearly published
- Objectives:
  - monitor the implementation of the new strategy
  - measure the participation of targeted justice professionals in judicial training on EU law, non-legal skills and language skills in the EU MS and Western Balkans
- For the report 2021 for the first time a dedicated <u>questionnaire</u>
   <u>for prison and probation staff</u> was launched





#### Annual report 2021 (1/8)

- Overall results:
  - 320 000 justice professionals or 25.3 % of all EU justice professionals received training on EU law in 2020
  - Between 2011 and 2020, over to 1.5 million justice professionals took part in such training activities.
  - Not including prison and probation staff



#### **Availability of EU law training**




